

what are media anyway?

so media are...

- ...technologies, artifacts or tools; hardware & software
- "For him a medium is any extension of ourselves that intermediates our interaction with our environment ." (Logan 2013, loc. 847)
- they create "service environments" and are "active metaphors"
- "Since all media are extensions of ourselves, or translations of some part of us into various materials, any study of one medium helps us to understand all others" (McLuhan 1964, S. 139).

probes, exploration & teaching

- "A probe for McLuhan was a **hypothesis that he would explore** not because he thought it was correct, but because **he found it interesting** and believed that it **might lead to new insights**. Unlike most academics, **McLuhan was more interested in making new discoveries than in always being correct**." (Logan 2013, loc. 609)
- "Anyone Who Tries to Make a Distinction Between Education and Entertainment Doesn't Know the First Thing About Either" – McLuhan (Logan 2013, loc. 689)




figure and ground




1st era speech

3rd era electricity























Fig. 142. — The nervous system. c, cerebellum; the large nerve of leg is the sciatic; the white line down the back is the spinal core

"Marshall's other cliché, 'the global village,' is a way of paraphrasing the fact that electronic technologies are an extension of the human central nervous system, and that our planet's collective neural wiring would create a single 24-7 blobby, fuzzy, quasi-sentient metacommunity." - Coupland 2010, p.13



electric age -> digital mediality

- all media become digitized versions, are we always online?
- **Acoustic Space**: "The acoustic world, which is the world of electric simultaneity, has no continuity, no homogeneity, no connections, and no stasis. Everything is changing." (McLuhan 2003, S. 226)
- media as service environment -> complex <u>media architectures</u>!?
